- Across all 5 Branches, the season resulted in 32,000 impacts for those in need – our highest ever.
- A new financial season emerged as our gracious donors exceeded \$2m in giving for the first time in our history.
- Our Housing Ministry entered a new season with the number of homes increasing from 5 to 12. Because of this, women, children, families, and the special needs community will be offered an affordable place to call home.
- Our Gospel Enterprises embraced a season of change, adding a second Clothing Closet store and relocating SimplyBe Coffee to new space in Leesburg.
- A new season has begun in our western Loudoun region with the relocation of our center to a new Main Street premises in Purcellville.

GOSPEL ENTERPRISES

Our two Gospel Enterprises continue to grow and make a profound impact in Loudoun. The addition of a second Clothing Closet in Leesburg and the relocation of SimplyBe to downtown Leesburg has allowed us to reach out to a wider community. The Clothing Closet's second location has made access to clothing far easier for those in

"Rick has a debilitating disease which has taken away the use of his fingers and legs. We went to visit and found that he was crawling up and down his stairs in order to go to doctor's appointments three times per week. He lived on one level and rarely left the house, except to go to appointments; it was extremely painful every time he left the house. Tree of Life committed to buying him a chairlift for his stairs, and contracted with a local company to build him a custom chairlift, as his stairs were narrow and winding. Within 3 months, he had his new chairlift, and now has ability to go up and down the stairs whenever he wants, greatly improving his quality of life."

The Prayer & Care Team assisted in **1,332** prayer requests and made an impact in the Kingdom by listening and praying with people in need. In many cases, these conversations included many call-backs to check in on partners.

The Share Team visited 5 nursing homes and assisted living facilities on a regular basis, conducted regular Bible Studies for senior adults and also for adults with special needs, and conducted regular visits to the jail. **224** members enjoy daily words of inspiration on our *Hope for Today* Facebook page.

"SPIRITUAL CARE is integral to our purpose. Our response to practical needs is only the first step in helping partners find abundant life in Christ"














HOW WE SPEND FUNDS
